




### TWO AREAS OF FOCUS

### SAN'IN KAIGAN GEOPARK

Located in the northernmost part of Hyogo Prefecture. Bordering the sea and fostering many mountains, this area has a vast array of outdoor activities.



### **AWAJI ISLAND**

South of Himeji and Kobe, Awaji is an island known for its beautiful sights and countless cycling routes. The most well-known route is called Awaichi, a circumnavigation of its coastline.



### ABOUT THE SAN'IN KAIGAN GEOPARK




Stretching from Tottori to Kyoto, the San'in Kaigan Geopark was designated as a Japanese Geopark in 2008, and admitted to the Global Geoparks Network in 2010. The Geopark has had diverse geomorphological and geological features from the time when the Japan Sea was born to the present.

# HIKING

The coast of Takeno Beach provides several interesting hiking spots. Travelers can hike through the lush trail on the Nekozaki Peninsula to reach the Nekozaki Lighthouse, which is Hyogo Prefecture's northernmost tip.


### KAYAKING






### KINOSAKI ONSEN

Kinosaki Onsen is a 1300-yearold hot spring town. The cozy atmosphere and 7 natural hot springs draw people in from all over looking for the perfect place to relax and unwind.



TAKENO BEACH

Among one of 100 best beaches in Japan, this beautiful hidden gem along the northern coast of Hyogo Prefecture is a great spot for swimming, kayaking, snorkeling, and more.




GENBUDO CAVES


### NISHIMURAYA HOTEL SHOGETSUTEI

Tatami mats extend to the end of the corridor in the modern Japanese-style building. A central outdoor garden completes the peaceful experience at this ryokan.




### DAY 1

Limited express train from Osaka, Kyoto, Kobe, or Himeji to Kinosaki Onsen. Go onsen-hopping and stroll through the canal-lined town. Stay in a *ryokan* (Nishimuraya Hotel Shogetsutei or Onishiya Suishoen, complete with a *kaiseki* dinner.



### DAY 2 (Option 1)

Have breakfast in the inn, and then take the JR train one stop to Takeno. At Takeno Beach, enjoy a geo sea kayaking activity, as well as hiking on the Nekozaki Peninsula and/or up Mt. Jajayama.



DAY 2 (Option 2)

Rent a bicycle from Kinosaki Onsen

Tourist Information SOZORO and
cycle 20 minutes to the Genbudo
Caves, made of columnar joints that
formed over 1.6 million years ago.
Spend the rest of the day cycling
and exploring more of Kinosaki.



### DAY 3

Try one of several cultural activities in Kinosaki Onsen. Visitors can choose between a Zen meditation experience, a calligraphy lesson, a tea ceremony experience, and more. Later, take a limited express train to Osaka, Kyoto, Kobe, or Himeji.





### CYCLING

With both flat stretches and hilly areas, Awaji Island provides cycling courses of varying difficulties for visitors. The most famous course is Awaichi, which is an 150-kilometer circuit along the coast of the island. Visitors can take breaks between stretches of cycling and visit a plethora of beautiful sights and interesting attractions.








### OTHER ACTIVITIES: SIGHTSEING

### NARUTO WHIRLPOOLS PUPPET THEATER

ESHIMA ISLAND

Considered as one of the three greatest currents in the world, the Naruto Strait's whirlpools are the fastest in Japan. Visitors can take an hour cruise ride to see these whirlpools up close.

The Awaji Puppet Theater has been designated as a nationally important intangible folk cultural property. It was protected by the feudal lords in the region, and the troupe performed all over the country.

Eshima Island breaks the surface of the water in the north, and has been designated as a Municipal Place of Scenic Beauty. The island has been renowned appears in many classical Japanese poems.

### SOME ACCOMMODATIONS

### **HOTEL NEW AWAJI**

Located on the east coast of Awaji Island, Hotel New Awaji has a most splendid view of the Kitan Strait and Osaka Bay from all guest rooms.



### **GLAMPING RESORT AWAJI**

Glamping (portmanteau of "glamorous" and "camping") has become very popular in Japan. This resort a domeshaped glamping facility where guests can barbecue, swim, and more.

### DAY 1

Take a highway bus from Maiko, Sannomiya, or Shin-Kobe Station to Sumoto Bus Station, then hotel shuttle bus to Hotel New Awaji and check in. Explore the area and see Sumoto Castle, Sumoto Artisan Square, and more.



### DAY 2 (Part 1)

Rent a bicycle from the Sumoto

Tourist Information Center and
travel south along the coast to stop
at various landmarks such as

Kakujuji Temple, Yagi Weeping Ume,
Onokoro Shrine, and Awaji Fureai

Park.



### DAY 2 (Part 2)

Have lunch in Minamiawaji, and continue cycling through the area.

Visit the Awaji Puppet Theater and more before checking into Awaji Island Uzushio Onsen Umemaru for the night.



### DAY 3

Take a bus down to the Higashiura Bus Terminal to rent a bicycle from the Cyclism AWAJI and travel south along the coast to stop at various landmarks such as Kakujuji Temple, Yagi Weeping Ume, Onokoro Shrine, and Awaji Fureai Park.



DAY 2 (Part 2)

Have lunch in Minamiawaji, and continue cycling through the area.







Island Monkey Center.




### DAY 2 (Part 2)

Check into Hotel New Awaji Plaza


Awajishima for the night and enjoy a kaiseki dinner, hot springs, massages, and more.

### ITINERARY ROUTE




